a message from the president

Oldenburg Academy thanks Betsy Savare for establishing the **Michael Savare Memorial Financial Tuition Assistance Fund**.

This fund was established in memory of Michael Savare, a young man who loved life and accepted people as they were. He was not a good student but was beloved by his teachers nevertheless. He was captain of his football team in high school and still holds the county record for number of yards rushed in one season.

He did very poorly on his SATs. His football coach was able to get him into a college, but he was academically ineligible to play football in his freshman year. Apparently, he used the time to get serious about his studies and was on the dean's list every semester. In his sophomore year he was a walk-on player (meaning he did not have a football scholarship) and made the team. He was a natural leader and was voted captain of that team in his junior and senior years.

At the time of Michael's death at the young age of twenty-one, he was engaged to his high school sweetheart and had been accepted in the state police program to become a state trooper.

a message from the principal

the classroom of the future

The other day as I observed our students entering the building I could not help but notice how many were struggling with their backpacks. Joking with some I asked "what do you have in there bowling balls?" but after giving it some thought an English, History, and Science textbook would weigh about as much as a bowling ball.

This all led me to think about the vision for future students at Oldenburg Academy. For the last few years the technology committee has been developing a plan labeled "the classroom of the future." That vision has had many twist and turns, but it is now becoming closer than ever before.

One to One computing will be a phrase that you will be hearing more and more at Oldenburg Academy. This program has been researched for the last two years and the initial stages are planned to begin shortly, if funding is granted. This program utilizes a Tablet PC, which is somewhat different than a laptop. In general, a tablet PC is a wireless personal computer (PC) that allows a user to take notes using natural handwriting with a stylus or digital pen on a touch screen. A tablet PC is similar in size and thickness to a yellow paper notepad and is intended to function as the user's primary personal computer as well as a note-taking device. Tablet PCs generally have two formats, a convertible model with an integrated keyboard and display that rotates 180 degrees and can be folded down over the keyboard -- or a slate style, with a removable keyboard. The

user's handwritten notes, which can be edited and revised, can also be indexed and searched or shared via e-mail or cell phone.

The Tablet PC will contain the textbooks for most classes. Students will no longer need to carry textbooks from class to class or lug that heavy backpack home each night. Students will be given a book that they may leave at home for reference. There will also be a classroom set of textbooks if the necessity arises.

Upgrades to the infrastructure of the academic building are currently taking place. New wireless technology is being installed. Classroom presentation tools are being investigated that will encourage effective note taking, and create more time for classroom collaboration. Teachers can poll the class or can even retrieve, display, and replay student-specific work to spark discussion. Students can lead class, collaborate, and share work with the teacher from their own seats—even at a distance. This allows for student and teacher connectedness.

Marc Prensky in his article Digital Natives, digital immigrants, describes our current generation of learners. "Today's students and young workers are part of a cohort he calls "Digital Natives." Raised on MTV, video games, e-mail, the Web and instant messaging, Digital Natives have developed cognitive thinking patterns that differ from previous generations. Prensky believes that new media and technology have intrinsically changed the way Digital Natives think, often in positive ways. As a result, the challenge facing educational institutions

is to recognize these cognitive differences and to develop learning offerings that are appropriate to their cognitive learning patterns." Digital Natives perceive technology as their friend and rely on it to study, work, play, relax and communicate. Natives dominate the seats in our classrooms and are an increasing presence in every school. One to One computing is part of Oldenburg Academy's vision for the Digital Natives walking our halls.

The challenge facing educators is to identify learning strategies that are appropriate for Digital Natives, recognizing the different ways they process information and developing learning tools that maximize the potential of their unique cognitive approach.

A digital immigrant is an individual who grew up without digital technology and adopted it later. Many of our teachers are digital immigrants and need to adapt to technological innovations for the classroom. That is why we are beginning this move into the realm futurist classroom with our teachers. It is our hope to shortly place Tablet PC's into the hands of our teachers to begin to diminish the learning curve between Digital Natives and Digital Immigrants.

Finally, if we are to prepare our young men and women for the future, sound instruction is essential. This instruction must include technological skills. As our graduates enter an ever shrinking and flat world we must assure them that they are well equipped to survey and succeed. The technological vision of One to One computing is the entry into a hi-tech world.

ELEVATOR SAFETY PROJECT

Oldenburg Academy of the Immaculate Conception thanks the John A. Hillenbrand Foundation, Inc., Rising Sun Regional Foundation, and the Sisters of St. Francis for contributions toward the Academic Building Elevator Safety Project. The elevator needed significant updating required by the State of Indiana to comply with the law regulating elevator safety as per Section 8.6.5.8 of the Safety Code for Elevators and Escalators, ASME A17.1-2000. A new cylinder with new PVC piping was installed. Oldenburg Academy's goal is to ensure that all classrooms in the Academy building are accessible to all, including those with special needs and who require the use of an elevator.

WATER PURIFICATION SYSTEMS

Oldenburg Academy of the Immaculate Conception is excited to announce, that Ripley County Community Foundation approved a grant request toward the purchase of two water purification systems for the ICA Hall building on campus. Installing these water systems will eliminate the use of bottled water. OA thanks the Ripley County Community Foundation for helping to protect the environment by conserving crude oil that is consumed in large quantities in the production of the plastic used in making containers for bottled water.

The United States population is the largest consumer of bottle water. 86% of the time plastic bottles are improperly discarded and create many environmental issues. Recycling projects are proved not to be economically successful due to the magnitude disposed of by U.S. citizens.

Oldenburg Academy visitors and staff will now aid in protecting the environment by using OA drinking glasses and water from the systems.

EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR

Oldenburg Academy of the Immaculate Conception is excited to announce, that The Franklin County Community Foundation approved a generous grant request toward the purchase of external defibrillator. This will provide OA with the necessary medical equipment to help save lives in times of emergencies.

Oldenburg Academy now has two external defibrillators. One is housed in the school and the other is housed in the cafeteria.
