## FROM THE PRINCIPAL



**Greetings Twister Friends and Family!** 

The fall of 2022 has brought about many changes to our school world at Oldenburg Academy. The two biggest changes are that we have a 7-period day now, increasing our contact minutes per class every period of every day, and we are starting school at 8:25 am instead of 8:00 am. Research shows that a later start is very beneficial for teengers, add to that the distance many of our students travel and that 25 minutes in the morning is very beneficial for many of them. We have maintained our hybrid schedule; we have a traditional 7-period day on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday, and we have block days on

Wednesday and Thursday. These block days allow our students extended class time for labs, activities, and collaboration. Each block day has 4 class periods; since we only have 7 class periods, that leaves us with one extra period every week, and thus the implementation of our Go Beyond Block.

Our faculty and students have had an amazing start to the school year. Our faculty is truy *Going Beyond* to make the educational experiences for our students impactful and unique. We have started a Culinary Arts program, and every week our students are chopping, sauteing, stirring, or baking up something amazing. They have been on multiple local field trips, including visiting a commercial kitchen and the apple orchard. The AP Environmental Science students visited a bird sanctuary, the Laurel Feeder Damn/start of the canal trail. The student media class has been revamped and in addition to working on our yearbook, they have a weekly news video "Around the 'Burg" that airs at school, and is posted on their Instagram site (@OA\_Twister\_Student\_Media), and have a weekly news segment on WRBI. We are in the process of creating a media studio in the basement for them to use as their production studio. In order to keep up with the ever-changing media world, the art program has new cameras, tables, and display boards. Our Seniors have filled out the Common App and are applying for colleges. I look forward to hearing about their admissions and scholarship offers!

It has been wonderful to welcome visitors back on our campus this year. We have 15 students from St. Louis taking Biology on the OA campus with our students and staff everyday. St. Nicholas has been using our facilities for their youth volleyball league weekly. All of the 8th grade students from the Batesville Deanery partner schools have spent a shadow day with our students on campus. The 6th grade students from St. Mary's Greensburg held their retreat on our campus. The class of 1972 held their 50 year reunion, and Alumni Homecoming weekend was celebrated by many! Our teachers have done an amazing job of reaching out to local community members to present to our students during the Go Beyond Block. (If you have any ideas of a skill you believe our students should learn, and are interested in presenting to a grade level of students, please reach out to the school office; we would love to have you!) College Recruiters are back on campus on a regular basis. We are looking forward to renewing Career Day, where our young alum will present to our current students. All of our athletic contests have been open to all fans all year. It is incredible that so many people are just now getting to see our amazing Feldhaus for the first time. Twister Tuesday's are available for on-campus shadow days and our Open House is scheduled for Sunday, November 13. Our campus is active, alive and super busy, and it has been such a blessing to be a small part of it all! Thank you for your continuous support for all of our students and staff, we appreciate you more than you will ever know!

# Going Beyond in ACADEMICS

One day a week, the students at Oldenburg Academy have 90 minutes of class time to truly **Go Beyond**. The students are divided into grade level groups and spend this time focusing on a very important aspect of their lives beyond our everyday academic curriculum. The Freshmen class is focusing on Music History and Appreciation. Students are learning to read and play music, as well as gaining a historical perspective on all genres of music. The Sophomore class is focusing on Community Service and Leadership. Being an integral part of the community in which you live is an important part of growing into successful adults. We want to show the students how they can make a difference, even at this point in their lives. Juniors and Seniors are focusing on the next steps in their lives. From truly trying to figure out, "What do I want to be when I grow up?," to learning how to make that happen, we are focusing on giving our students every opportunity to be ready for what's next when they leave Oldenburg Academy. The Go Beyond Blocks are team-taught by three or four faculty members dedicated to creating a unique and innovative learning experience for all students.





#### Freshmen - Music History and Appreciation

Our Freshmen Go Beyond Block is focused on introducing students to a wide range of instruments including strings, woodwinds, brass, and piano! Every freshman is learning an instrument with the intention of performing a concert at the end of the semester. Students are also working on honing their singing skills; they started with the "Alma Mater" and are slowly working into other holiday music. Future plans include guest musicians, including the IU Jazz group, and workshop instructors. Students are gaining a greater understanding and appreciation of music and the performing arts and, for many, it has ignited a new interest in music.



#### Juniors - College and Career Readiness

The Junior Go Beyond Block is focused on College, Career, and Planning. Students are given the opportunity to explore different college majors and careers, along with learning the steps needed to achieve their desired paths after graduation. A combination of guest speakers, personality and academic assessment tools, college and university counselor visits, and test prep skills, are part of the curriculum for our juniors, helping students gain a better understanding of how their interests, strengths, and personalities link up with different colleges, trades, career options and post high school plans.



#### Seniors - Career and Life Readiness

For the Senior Go Beyond Block, students are taking the next steps in their college and career planning and focusing on college applications, scholarships, and participating in mock interviews. Visiting college and university admission counselors along with representatives for the military have met with seniors and shared more insight into their programs. Guest speakers are scheduled throughout the year focusing on various careers. A second semester focus will be on everyday life skills like personal finance, cooking, or how to change a tire!



#### Sophomores - Community Service and Leadership

Our sophomore Go Beyond Block is focused on the importance of community service and involvement. Each week approximately ½ of the sophomore class helps at either Twice Blessed or with the Sisters of St. Francis. For those not out serving that week, students are working in small groups to create their own service projects that we will work to implement to allow them to raise money/donations for a cause of their choosing. Guest speakers have presented to this group focusing on the value of volunteering your gifts and sharing those gifts with others. Students are experiencing first-hand the importance of giving back and what it means to be a servant leader.





#### **ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES**

Mrs. Yane's Environmental Studies class visited the Mary Gray Bird Sanctuary and the Whitewater Feeder Dam in Laurel. The class is studying biodiversity and the sanctuary allowed them to see how undisturbed ecosystems foster much more biodiversity than the human impacted ones with which we are most familiar. They also collected samples at various sites to test water quality.



#### FRESHMAN RETREAT

The Freshman enjoyed a Retreat on September 30 at Oldenburg Academy. The theme was "My identity is in Christ; I am a child of God." Father Danny Bedel celebrated Mass and shared a witness talk; he and Fr. Pondo also heard confessions. Brother Hayden Rodrigue from the Legionaries of Christ also joined us to share his witness talk. Additionally, Mrs. Angie Myers lead us in praise and worship. Close to 35 juniors and seniors assisted throughout the day by leading small groups, giving witness talks, and helping with activities. The retreat was a day of faith and fun. We ended the day by praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00.















#### **CULINARY ARTS**


A parent meeting will be held in the OA Feldhaus during the Placement Test date.




