ENROLLMENT

The enrollment for 2021-2022 is 155, with approximately 44% male and 56% female. Students come from over 15 different middle schools in five counties in southeastern Indiana and southwestern Ohio. Approximately 90% of students are Catholic and 10% are of other denominations or faiths.

FACULTY & ADMINISTRATION

Of the 21 OA faculty and administrators, 52% hold advanced degrees. A student to teacher ratio of 9:1 and average class size of 13 provide a highly personalized approach to learning.

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

- The Class of 2022 earned over \$6 million in college scholarships. Of the 52 graduates, 92% are pursuing post-secondary education and 8% are entering the workforce.
- The Class of 2022 included a Lilly Endowment Finalist, an Indiana Academic All-Star, a National Merit Commended Scholar, and 2 Next Generation Hoosier Educator Scholars.
- In the Class of 2022, 23 of the graduates (44%) achieved the Indiana College Core through Ivy Tech Community College with 5 graduates earning an Associates Degree.

HONORS DIPLOMA

- In the Class of 2022, 23 graduates (44%) achieved the Indiana College Core through Ivy Tech Community College with 5 graduates earning an Associates Degree.
- In the Class of 2022, 38 of the 52 graduates (73%) earned Indiana Academic Honors Diplomas.

CLASS SCHEDULE

OA operates on a two-semester schedule with 7 class periods meeting everyday. Each day has a 15-minute period focused on college to career readiness, student organization meetings, and peer tutoring. Classes begin at 8:25 AM and end at 3:20 PM.

DRESS CODE

Khaki or navy tailored pants, embroidered navy or white OA polo or white oxford shirts, and OA spirit wear sweatshirts are worn daily. A total of 60 hours of service and volunteer activities are expected of all students during their four years at OA. Students are involved in volunteer and service activities reflective of the Franciscan Sponsorship Values. Students who reach 100 service hours will be recognized with a Centennial Service Award, and students who reach 500 service hours will be recognized with the Franciscan Service Award.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Oldenburg Academy offers 12 Advanced Placement courses. AP courses are more heavily weighted in terms of GPA due to the advanced nature of the information covered. These courses offer students the opportunity to do college level work while they are still in high school. Students earn college credit hours based on their scores on the National Advanced Placement Exams taken in May each year. AP courses are listed on the course list

DUAL CREDIT COURSES

Oldenburg Academy offers 16 dual credit courses on campus in partnership with Ivy Tech Community College. Dual Credit is an option for high school students to simultaneously take college classes while in high school, to receive college credit, and to fulfill high school requirements. Current dual credit course offerings include Anatomy & Physiology (101 & 102), Medical Terminology, Finite Math, AP Calculus, English 12, AP English Literature, Advanced Speech Communications, Introduction to Interpersonal Communication, Pre-Calculus (136 & 137), Spanish III (101 &102), AP Spanish (201 & 202), Principles of Marketing, World Religions, Christian Ethics, American Literature, AP English Language (111 & 215)

COLLEGE TO CAREER READINESS PROGRAM

Each senior participates in a community-partner internship or capstone project to culminate their high school experience and become familiar with real-world applications of their intended college major. Students are challenged to go above and beyond the textbook and apply their knowledge from the past four years assisting them to narrow down their college major, thus preparing them for college, all the way to their career.

FRESHMAN ACADEMY

During the first quarter, freshmen will attend a series of mini classes to help ease the transition for freshmen into high school and welcome them into the OA family. Topics discussed include service/volunteer hours, note-taking skills, technology, student services, GPAday, organizational skills, test-taking tips, and cultural awareness.
